Why This Matters

Many parents are unaware that social media platforms often suggest their children's accounts to adults in their networks. While most adults may pose no concern, it only takes one or two problematic individuals for harm to occur. What may begin as online harassment can, in some cases, escalate to more serious forms of harassment or even exploitation.

What Parents and Schools Need to Know

- Social media algorithms, not parents or children, often determine who is suggested as a connection.
- Parents and children should have the ability to control who connects with them online.
- Proactive conversations about online safety can help children recognize and avoid unhealthy or risky interactions.

Tips for Parents and Guardians

- ✓ Do not assume all online connections are safe, even if the adult is someone you know offline.
- ✓ If a platform suggests your child's account to an adult, avoid connecting directly.
- ✓ If a connection is appropriate, discuss it with the child's parents or guardians first, and let the child initiate the connection when safe.
- ✓ Maintain ongoing, age-appropriate conversations about digital safety, boundaries, and respectful online behavior.

Know Your Rights: COPPA

The Children's Online Privacy Protection Act (COPPA) gives parents control over the personal information collected from children under 13.
